RE: Survey shows anxious and frustrated electorate

Future Majority conducted a voter survey of the competitive congressional districts (districts Joe Biden won in 2020 that Republicans won in 2022, as well as districts a Republican won by less than five points in 2022) on a wide range of issues. The survey of 2,461 voters was conducted by Change Research from May 6-9, 2023.

The survey shows an increasingly frustrated and anxious electorate. If the 2024 election were held today, the results would likely once again be a narrowly divided government that could go to either group. When asked who voters would choose if the 2024 election for U.S. House of Representatives were held today, 44% say they would choose the Republican, 42% say they would choose the Democrat, and 14% are not sure.

#### **Topline Findings:**

- The Democrats' message continues to work against the Republicans' extreme agenda. We tested a summary of Joe Biden's campaign launch message against summaries of Donald Trump's and Ron DeSantis' messages. Voters prefer Biden's message 50% to 43%, with 50% of Independents backing the Freedom Frame argument over the MAGA argument. The choice narrows when Biden's message is compared to the DeSantis message, with 48% choosing the Biden Freedom Frame over 45% who choose the DeSantis culture war frame. The House Democrats "For the People" frame is similarly effective, with 51% preferring it to the Trump/MAGA message.
  - Voters want to protect the freedom to live more than the Second Amendment. 52% of voters say they care more about "ensuring that every American has the freedom to live safely, without fear of gun violence" while 41% care more about "protecting the Second Amendment rights of gun owners."
  - Like other surveys, wide majorities favor common-sense gun reform. Efforts by the movement for gun reforms have made a lasting impact. 70% of voters say they support requiring the purchase of weapons like AR-15s to require training and safety courses, insurance requirements, and waiting periods of at least two weeks. 59% of respondents who are gun owners support the proposal. This proposal earns 56% of support for a candidate who uses it compared to 34% for a message about protecting the Second Amendment rights of Americans.



- Voters continue to see Republicans as more extreme than Democrats (46% to 42%) and wide margins identify efforts by state legislatures to restrict individual and economic freedoms as extreme. An overwhelming 93% of Democrats and 67% of Independents respond that MAGA Republicans threaten democracy.
- The power of misinformation. 67% of Republicans in the survey report that they believe that Donald Trump got more votes than Joe Biden in 2020, with 21% of Republicans responding that they are not sure. Just 12% of Republicans respond that they believe Joe Biden received more votes in 2020.
- While Democrats may be able to win in future elections, there is a clear and ominous, much larger challenge: 90% say they agree that "Things feel more out of control in America today than they have during any other time in my life."
  - 41% of voters respond that overall, they would say that "no one in Washington is doing much of anything right now" and they are either angry or frustrated by that. This rises to 52% with Independent voters.
    Democrats should continue to focus efforts on making the case that their economic agenda is delivering for America.
  - Meanwhile, 75% respond that they are falling behind the cost of living, just 36% respond that they make the full payment on their credit card each month, and 72% respond that they feel like they do not matter much or at all in America. 76% respond that they are concerned about the impact on the U.S. financial system of the recent collapse of two major U.S. financial institutions. 83% respond that we are either already in a recession or one is very likely by the end of the year.
  - o 71% of respondents (55% of Democrats, 75% of Independents, and 82% of Republicans) say that today's children in America will grow up worse off than people are now. 22% say about the same, and just 7% say that today's children will be better off than people are now.
- Open-ended results show top issues for voters who do not approve of Joe Biden's job performance. We asked voters who "Somewhat Disapprove" or are "Not Sure" about Biden's job performance as president, "What is the main thing Joe Biden can do to improve your approval of his job?" We used AI to analyze and categorize the responses.



- The issues for Democrats are canceling student loan debt, addressing LGBTQ rights and issues, improving COVID-19/pandemic response, addressing gun violence, implementing policies to address climate change, and achieving universal healthcare and protecting abortion rights.
- The issues for Independents are immigration and border security, improving communication and transparency, balancing progressive and conservative values, addressing the budget and economic stability, more proactive in addressing issues, and improving the healthcare system.
- The issues for Republicans are curbing immigration and improving border control, maintaining a moderate political stance, focusing on economic stability and growth, improving foreign policies, and addressing domestic policy issues.
